# Youth Navigator Network as a **response...**

November 2020, the Children Services Transformation Advisory Council released their final report, which included a recommendation for a tool to help connect youth & caregivers to resources and information.


- Youth and young adults requested a tool that could help them locate and access services in their community.
- The tool would need to be widely accessible by phone, website and an app – and provide necessary assistance to connect with supports.

## Who is Youth Navigator Network for?



#### Youth Navigator Network serves...

- Young persons who are ages 14 to 21.
- Young persons who are currently in foster care.
- Young persons who have aged out of foster care.
- Young persons who have had a child welfare case (including Title IV-E court cases) within the last 24 months, regardless of custody status.



## What does Youth Navigator Network do?



The Youth Navigator Network (YNN) is a flexible and responsive navigator program designed to support children and youth in foster care and the post-care transition. Building on the premise that **youth are inherently capable of finding solutions to the circumstances and challenges they face**, the YNN program will take an inclusive, engaging, and genuine approach to strengthening youth and their networks.

#### Service delivery can look like...

Information

Identify supports using a curated database of youth specific resources.

Referral

Share tailored e-binders of community resources specific to young person's identified needs.

Access

Provide supportive guidance to navigate and access resources.

With the support of ODJFS, a project management team, evaluation partner, partnering sites & the Implementation Advisory Council, YNN learns more about the needs and existing gaps in services & resources.

YNN also receives support from our site partners and the Young Adult Advisory Council (YAAC). The YAAC uses their collective power to shape and influence YNN programming, procedures & policies.









# What is the **Implementation Advisory Council?**

- The Implementation Advisory Council includes representatives from an array of systems and services that interact with young people who have been impacted by the child welfare system.
- Currently represented on the council are practitioners
  who work in the child welfare arena, youth housing and
  homelessness, secondary and post-secondary education
  and transition age youth services.
- The council meets on a quarterly basis in support of shared learning and strategizing ways for program iteration.

# What is the **Young Adult Advisory Council?...**

- The Young Adult Advisory Council is comprised of young persons ages 14-26 who have lived experienced with the child welfare system.
- Council members share their wisdom, knowledge and expertise in support of YNN's implementation and development.
- Young people receive a stipend for their time and receive professional development support from YNN's Program Coach.
- Nominations to the council are always welcomed!






# Young people engaged with YNN will **experience...**

## Frontline workers & youth directly impacted by child welfare to **be equipped with...**

A statewide, coordinated entry/access system that can collect data on common barriers to service access, identify service gaps, and leverage data to improve accessibility across communities.
